## **Mission**

To facilitate a process where marginalised groups can become self-sufficient in improving their health, environmental, economic and social needs. To achieve this by working in partnership with other development actors in the spirit of art, culture and community.

## **About Us**

Blossom was founded in 1993 as a grassroots NGO with the initial focus on social, economic and cultural empowerment of underprivileged women and children. Since then, blossom has broadened its vision to building community capacity in disadvantaged and high-risk areas of Tamil Nadu, with a particular focus on prevention, care and support for HIV/AIDS and TB.

Blossom builds the capacity of communities by forming partnerships with community based organisations and stakeholders in society. Blossom uses a participatory approach to development, involving beneficiaries in the planning, implementation and monitoring and evaluation of its projects.

Blossom undertakes a wide variety of community projects ranging from: welfare and advocacy, childhood education, economic and social empowerment of women and raising awareness about socially sensitive issues surrounding HIV/AIDS, TB and the environment.

## **The Directors Desk 2012-2013**

The Blossom Trust had a very successful year and we are one step closer to "giving a voice to the voiceless." We are working towards our mission of building self-sufficiency among marginalized groups by meeting their health, environmental and social needs. We have targeted our efforts towards those who are often unheard by society; namely women, children and people living with or affected by HIV/AIDS or TB.



### ***Blossom Trust Updates***

Our organization is blossoming. This year was one of our busiest years yet with many results and accomplishments. We continued to strengthen the following existing projects: Family Counselling Clinic (FCC), Prevention of Parent To Child Transmission of HIV/AIDS (PPTCT), Blossom Creche, Buds Network and Mahalir Thittam. We also continued to care for the orphaned children in the Dayspring Home and made improvements to the Blossom Farm. An infrastructural change we made was moving the Kanchipuram district office from Guduvanchery to Tambaram.

### ***Personal Accomplishments***

This year I was selected as a member of the NGO's Delegation to the Global Fund for AIDS, TB and Malaria in Geneva. So far I've participated in two executive board meetings of UNITAID which were held in Geneva and Sri Lanka. I was also appointed by the state government as a member in the Juvenile Justice Board in Virudhunagar. Additionally, I was selected as a board member and joint secretary in the Tamil Nadu Voluntary Health Association (TNVHA), a state level network of 300 NGO's working in the health sector. These new positions broaden Blossom's network which helps spread awareness, create new connections, and gain access to resources.

I would like to sincerely thank all our donors and sponsors, our board of Trustees, and all our dedicated staff and volunteers. I very much look forward to the 2013-2014 year where Blossom will continue to build the capacity for marginalized groups.

## **Buds Network**

This programme was started in 2007 as part of the Palmyrah Workers Development Society (PWDS) Alliance Care and Support Project. Its aim was to form a group for children living with and affected by HIV/AIDS along with other children to reduce the stigma/discrimination and to build support among themselves.

Although the project ended in 2010, Blossom continues its support and has strengthened and expanded the *Buds Network*. It is now a network of children's clubs and education centres which include all disadvantaged children within the community.

The 'after school' networks focus on academic and physical education and life skill development. Along with motivating the kids to work hard in school, the programme counsels parents and teachers to ensure that the children's education is a top priority. The centres practice a "Re1 scheme" where children are encouraged to save Rs. 1 a day. The children learn the benefits of saving money when they are allowed to purchase educational materials with the money they have collected. There are now only three centres running which are in Kariyapatti, Appainaickenpatti and Kancheepuram. These three Buds centres are now supported by IDF in Mumbai and renamed as 'Bal Gurukul' centres.

## **Blossom Creche**

As women's economic and cultural power increases, so do their opportunities to find work. One obstacle that still prevents women from working, however, is childcare. Blossom understood this need and developed a crèche (childcare centre) in 2003. Feedback from women reveals this is a vital tool for mother labourers. The crèche is in operation in Pandian Nagar, a suburb of Virudhunagar and there are currently 26 children aged between 2 and 4 years old. The site is operated by a trained teacher and an assistant. All the children are fed a free nutritious lunch and are provided with monthly medical check-ups. Parent-teacher meetings provide much needed feedback for the wellbeing of the children and the development of the community. The crèche continues to be supported by the Tamil Nadu Social Welfare Board in Chennai.



## **Poomalai Women's Collective**

Blossom identified a long felt need in the community for financial education and support, which led to the creation of *Poomalai*, an umbrella federation of women's Self Help Groups (SHGs). This federation remains the managerial and catalytic force behind the progress and development of empowering women. With the numbers of enrollment increasing annually we now have more than 1000 groups in the Poomalai Federation.

Poomalai projects are divided in two sectors: Microcredit and ROSE Marketing. Microcredit helps impoverished rural and urban women gain access to small loans to invest in an income generating activity. Weekly meetings are organized and members save on average Rs. 25/- per week. The savings are deposited into the bank and then divided up as loans to the members. After operating for six months, and if certain requirements are met, the SHGs become eligible to apply for a bank loan after which the funds can be lent to their most needy members. Blossom is continuing in its participatory role in securing bulk loans from major corporations such as RMK, Delhi and ICICI Bank in Madurai. Once people have benefited from the Microcredit project, project ROSE (Rural Opportunity for Social Emancipation for Women) helps them establish a sustainable business.

## **ROSE – Rural Opportunities for Social Emancipation**

The goal of ROSE is to reinforce and strengthen the economic development undertaken in the *Poomalai Women's Collective* through fair trade and rural marketing. The rural marketing division works under the principle of U2R (Urban to Rural). This is where household needs will be secured at fair prices for the local people in remote areas. Once people have benefited from a Microcredit project in Poomalai, project ROSE helps them establish a sustainable business. ROSE searches for leaders in the local markets who are willing to train the women to become rural agents. These newly trained female rural leaders support the local people in making their projects financially sustainable.

The ROSE fair trading division is the active marketing link between Poomalai and potential buyers. Self-help groups have raised awareness about the amenities available for sale. Products such as phenoyl, handbags and fabrics have been recognised and promoted. So far ROSE has identified 96 rural agents and social entrepreneurship is becoming a key economic strategy in the communities. This year ROSE has registered with a network of small business units called India trade.com. This greatly improves the communities' chances of gaining contracts to start large scale production within their businesses.

## **Mahalir Thittam**

Blossom has been working in partnership with this project since 2000 and it is supported by Tamil Nadu Women's Development Corporation Ltd, Chennai. The project's aim is to ensure rural women's social and economical prosperity by facilitating the creation of their own revenue streams. One major difficulty faced by women is gaining access to and control of their own money. In order to help them tackle this problem, the project team organises women into Self Help Groups (SHGs) and provides them with Animator & Representative (A&R) training, Entrepreneur Development Programme (EDP) training and Vocational Training Programme (VTP).

## **Rainbow TB Forum**

Rainbow TB Forum is one of Blossom's CBOs (community based organization) that aims to provide a voice and platform for the rights of TB patients. The Forum began when a group of young students who were part of Blossom's CEPT project were discriminated against by government hospitals when being tested for TB. The original group of 7 members mobilized with other TB patients and there are now over 600 members across the state. Although it has become an independent network with its own legal identity, Blossom continues to promote and nurture the Forum.

Regular monthly meetings are conducted in each district to raise TB awareness, form a social support network for TB patients and reduce self-stigmatization and isolation. The members of the organization also monitor the TB testing centres to make sure that there is no discrimination

- Provide the phone numbers of the Forum leaders to patients, health-centres, NGO's, medical shops and other members of the community so that they can quickly respond to any violation of rights
- Links patients with children's crèches and makes arrangements for providing lunch to the children affected by TB
- Has found places in the Governing Board of the PTCC (Partnership for Tuberculosis Care and Control), New Delhi and represents TB patients in the Board meetings



## **Blossom Dayspring Home**

The Dayspring Home is an orphanage established in 2003. The children are either orphaned due to the death of family members caused by HIV/AIDS/TB, or infected and rejected from their families due to the stigma surrounding the disease. The orphanage is currently home to 25 children, however this number fluctuates throughout the year depending on the circumstances in the community and around the districts. Blossom provides all the day-to-day running of the project which includes; medical expenses, educational needs, 3 nutritious meals a day, clothes and social support. One goal of the home is to reintegrate the children that have been rejected back into their families by providing ongoing social and medical support through parent counseling, education and self-help groups.

This year five children left the home (Maniraja, Maheswaren, Ishwarrya, Resukutty and Selvakumar. Two left for another orphanage and 3 were introduced back into their family life. We were happy to welcome David to the Dayspring Family this year.

### **Volunteers**

Over the last year, 38 volunteers have contributed to the organization by helping on the farm, donating items such as groceries and stationary and helping the children with their studies.

### **Funding**

Dayspring Home only needs \$7,500 per year to operate and relies on donations to support the children. Various fundraising initiatives are organised by blossom to ensure the financial requirements of the home are met.

We've recently initiated the 'sponsor a child' programme and the 'meal a day' scheme which shows potential donors how a small contribution can make a large difference in a child's life:

- \$10** will support a child for over 1 week
- \$25** will support a child for 1 Month
- \$150** will support a child for 6 months
- \$300** will support a child for 1 year



## **Blossom Organic Farm**

The Blossom Farm was established by an aid organization called Caritas Sweden in 2002 with the idea of creating a sustainable food income for the children and the Dayspring Home and the Blossom organization. The farm is located next to the Dayspring Home on 6 acres of land and is maintained by the Blossom Farm team who tends to the livestock and crops. We are always looking for volunteers to join our team.

### ***Thinking of the Environment***

The farm is taking steps to be as eco-friendly and healthy as possible:

- It is in the process of becoming fully organic. Instead of using pesticides, we are now using manure from the livestock as fertilizer.
- Another new addition is the production of 'Vermi-Compost'. Worms are used to fertilize and enrich the soil resulting in better yields on production.
- This year we plan to further utilize the manure by using it in our new small bio-gas plant. It was installed with the help of Caritas Linkoping. The plant turns the waste of the livestock into gas to cook with. This is not only environmentally friendly but is also very cost effective.
- To conserve water we use a drip irrigation system which collects rain water that is slowly released across the farm through a pipe system.
- The farm also contains a well which stores safe water for the children during the summer when the rains are scarce.

### ***A Nutritious Lifestyle***

The farm aims to produce adequate vegetables, fruit, milk and eggs for the children and sells any excess production to the local community for revenue. This year the site has 3 cows and 11 chickens. The farm ensures that the children get an adequate amount of food with three balanced meals a day.



## **Project Axshya**

Project Axshya is a civil society initiative with the goal of strengthening TB care and control in India. The project is a timely intervention that aligns with the Stop TB strategy and supports India's Tuberculosis Programme to achieve the Millennium Development Goals.

The project began with the support from the Catholic Health Association of India (CHAI) in the Virudhunagar District and REACH, Chennai (Resource group for Education and Advocacy for Community Health) in Kancheepuram District, both of which are partners of the Global Fund Against TB and Malaria (GFATM). Through the GFATM-9 project, Blossom-organized cultural programmes were carried out to raise awareness and understanding. Staff Training was undertaken to ensure a more viable future for the project.

Referral of TB suspects for sputum collection has helped in the early diagnostic stages and therefore leads to greater numbers of cured patients. Sensitization meetings in high risk communities have targeted TB positive groups to change their lifestyle in order to combat the disease.

## **Prevention of Parent to Child Transmission of HIV/AIDS (PPTCT)**

This is a project that Blossom has been working on since 2005 and is one of the most fundamental in tackling the future eradication of HIV/AIDS. The funding has continued through Investment Lease and Financial Services Corporate (IL&FS) in Chennai, under project RCC-II.

This is a specific programme that provides a comprehensive, family-centred range of support, clinical services and public health initiatives with the central goal of preventing the transmission of HIV/AIDS from parents to their babies. Since 2004, we have tested 21576 ANC mothers, 2605 of which was accomplished last year alone.

### ***Care and Support Meetings***

Specialist Blossom counsellors conduct meetings with people living with HIV/AIDS for emotional and psychological support, as well as acting to build support groups within the community.

### ***PPTCT Outreach Workers Support Services***

A team of 6 trained Blossom staff in Virudhunagar provide additional support services to mothers during pregnancy, delivery and post-natal care.

### ***PPTCT in Kancheepuram District***

The success of PPTCT project has grown over the last 2 years. The project's expansion last year resulted in the opening of the office in Guduvancheri and its subsequent hiring of 13 outreach workers and a coordinator to work in 13 blocks.

## **Family Counselling Centre**

The Family Counselling Centre (FCC) project commenced in 1999 to protect the rights and well being of women and children within the community. Specialist Blossom counsellors offer psychological, legal, economic, medical and educational support to women and children who are in need and primarily victimised through domestic violence and family disputes. The project also raises awareness about the role of women in society and their rights. FCC is a member of the District Advisory Committee for crime against woman and for the prevention of domestic violence. It is also a member of the District Advisory Committee for the prevention of child abuses, child trafficking and child prostitution. The FCC project is funded by the Central Welfare Board in New Delhi.

### ***What the Family Counselling Centres do***

- Provide Pre-Marital and Marital counselling
- Conduct counselling awareness programmes for schools/college students.
- Conduct one day training on counselling skills, and guidance on application for women police personnel
- Career guidance at schools/colleges
- Workshops on adolescent reproductive health

### ***Women Advisory Centre***

The Women Advisory Centre (WAC) works with the Virudhunagar Collectorate to fight injustices against women and promote their legal rights. The WAC inquiry panel consists of a solicitor, Inspector of Police, District Social Welfare Officer, Counsellor and a Blossom FCC member.

### ***Counsellors at All Women Police Station***

Our counsellors attend the family related cases in the Virudhunagar AWPS every Monday. A male counsellor joins the Police Mobile counselling team to villages on every Monday evening. Having both a male and female counsellor can help with the family dispute. Blossom FCC maintains a good rapport with the police authorities.

### ***Awareness Programs***

Twenty-eight awareness programs have been conducted to observe the world UN days in order to create awareness and effect behavioural change. For example on International Women's Day we conducted a meeting where we created awareness about women's rights and women empowerment.

### **Paneer Poo HIV Positive Women's Network (PPWN)**

This CBO (community based organisation) formed by Blossom is a women's network for HIV/AIDS sufferers living in isolation and/or poverty. It started as a social support network and eventually formed into own trust organisation. This year they have memberships in TNVHA Chennai (Tamil Nadu Volunteer Health Association) and PTCC New Delhi (Partnership for Tuberculosis Care and Control) which is a great acknowledgment of their hard work.

### ***Empowering women in the community***

- Advocating women's rights with a particular focus on property entitlement.
- Creating employment opportunities in the community at the DIC (drop in centre) and the maintenance of public toilet in Virudhunagar government hospital.

### ***Improve health and well-being of PLHA***

- Provide nutrition support for people living with HIV/AIDS and receiving ART (anti-retroviral therapy) treatment by providing eggs, milk and vitamin A supplements.
- Running a drop in centre (DIC) for women and children living with HIV/AIDS. Three hundred and twelve people living with HIV/AIDS used the services and 148 TB patients visited the centre.
- The PPWN leaders participate in the district advisory committee meetings organised by the District Collector once every 3 months.

### **Global Giving Campaign**

There has also been a campaign with global giving to raise more global awareness and funds for the children with TB. Blossom will provide 1000 poor TB children with nutrients for 6 months with the DOTS Treatment period to get fully cured from TB. Our aim is to save 1000 precious children living in Tamil Nadu. ## **District Resource Centre – TNVHA, Chennai**

The TNVHA (Tamil Nadu Voluntary Health Association) is an association of voluntary organisations working for health promotion in Tamil Nadu. Blossom acts as the Virudhunagar District Resource Center for the TNVHA by coordinating the District Facilitation Centers (DFCs) and facilitating the District Coordination Committee (DCC). There are currently 11 NGO members in Virudhunagar district who attend the AGBM (Annual General Board Meeting) held at Tuticorin in 2013.

### ***Our District Resource Center does the following:***

- Provides a platform for members to come together once a month where they share experiences.
  - Builds the capacity of its members through training.
  - Identifies issues and pooled resources for campaign lobbying and policy advocacy.
  - Provides relevant updated information to the member organisations.
